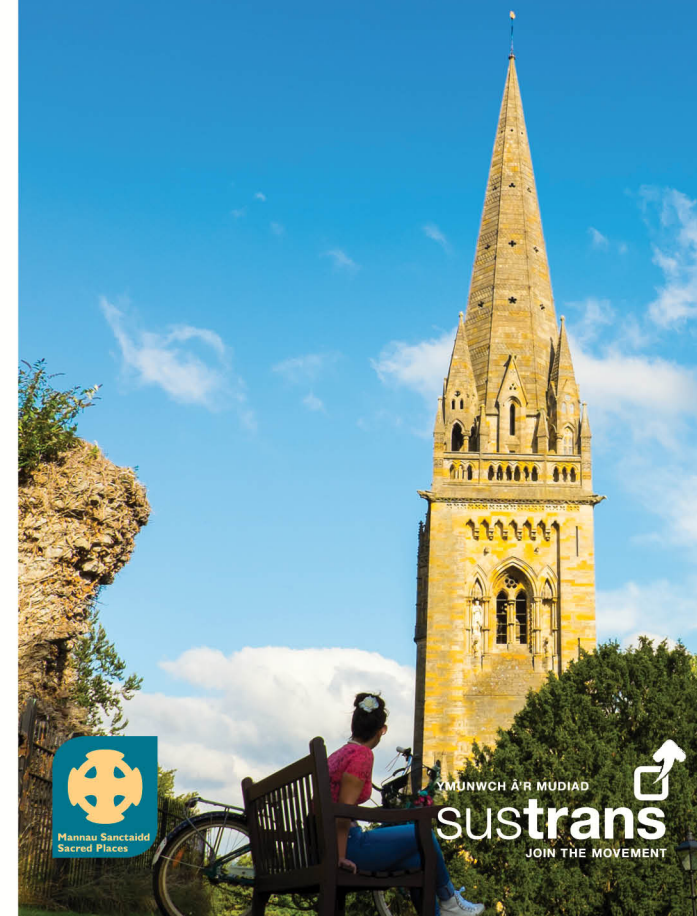

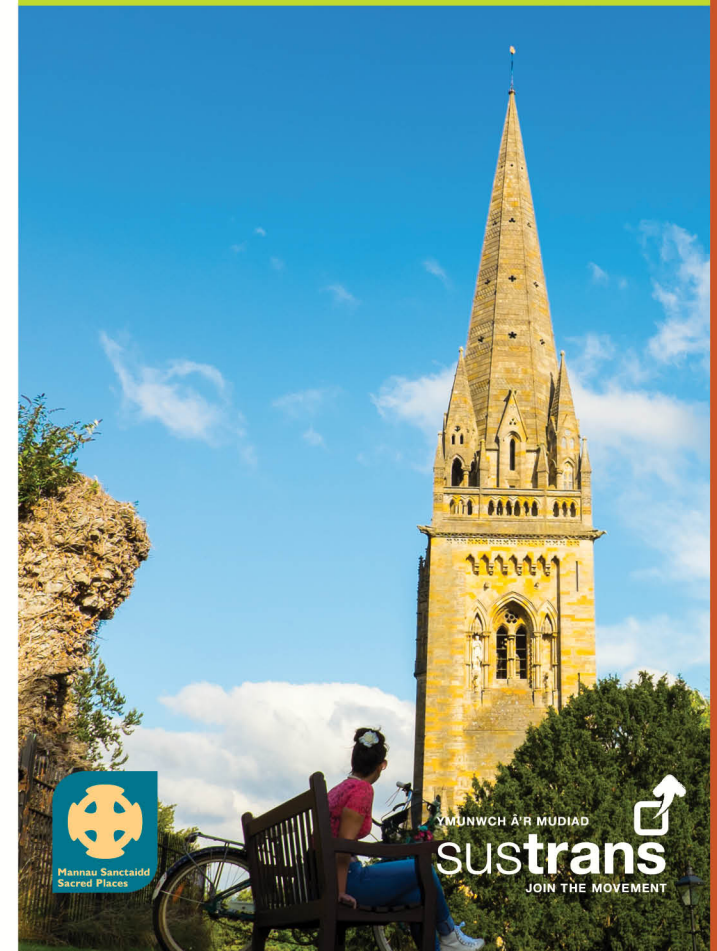

Cycle Routes



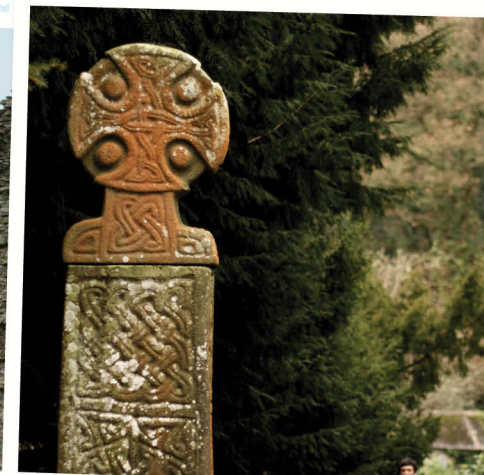

Lon Las Cymru – Gogledd (8)

Caerdydd – Cwm Elan 250 milltir
Gan gysylltu Caerdydd i gefn gwlad trawiadol canolbarth Cymru, mae hanner gogleddol y llwybr 250 milltir o hyd hwn yn cynnig profiad treftadaeth Cymreig ardderchog. Gallwch ymweld ag Ynys Môn sy'n llawn dirgel gyda'i safleoedd claddu hynafol a'i meini hirion. Archwiliwch Eglwys Gadeiriol Bangor - yr unig Eglwys Gadeiriol yn y DU sydd wedi cael ei defnyddio'n ddi-dor ers ei chychwyn. Mae'r llwybr yn parhau ar hyd cyrion Penrhyn Llŷn a Ffynnon Cybi, tra bydd Abaty Cymer ger Dolgellau yn eich atgoffa o orffennol mynachaudd Cymru.

Llwybr Arfordirol Gogledd Cymru (5)

Ynys Môn – Caer 105 milltir
Mae Llwybr Arfordirol Gogledd Cymru yn rhedeg ar hyd arfordir gogleddol Cymru ac yn cadw'n dynn ar Fôr Iwerddon am adrannau hir o'i 105 milltir (170km) rhwng Caerdydd a Chaer. Rydych yn sicr o gael eich llethu gan strwythur mawreddog Castell Conwy, yn cynnwys ei dŵr capel hynod gyda'i ffenestri lliw a gomisiynydd yn ddiweddar. Darganfyddwch eglwys gadeiriol leiaf Prydain yn Llanelwy sy'n sefyll ar lannau hardd Afon Elwy.

Lôn Teifi - (RhBC 82)

Aberystwyth – Abergwaun 98 milltir
Gan ddringo nifer o fryniau a nadreddu ar hyd lonydd gwledig a ffyrdd tawel, mae'r llwybr hwn yn fwy addas ar gyfer beicwyr mwy profiadol. Yn ogystal â'r cefn gwlad perffaith a'r doreth o fywyd gwylt, fe welwch hefyd lu o safleoedd cysegredig yn cynnwys adeilion hynafol Abaty Ystrad Fflur, a oedd unwaith yn ganolfan i ddiwylliant ac addoliad yng Nghymru, a chastell mawreddog Cilgerran. Ar ben deheuol y llwybr hwn ceir safle arbennig Eglwys Gadeiriol Tyddewi a Phlas yr Esgob Tyddewi - cyrchfan i bererinion ers y ddeuddegfed ganrif.

Lon Las Cymru – North (8)

Holyhead – Eilan Valley 250 miles
Connecting Holyhead to the stunning rural countryside of mid Wales, the northern half of this fantastic 250 mile route offers a superb Welsh heritage experience. Visit the mysterious Isle of Anglesey with its ancient burial sites and standing stones. Explore Bangor Cathedral - the only Cathedral in the UK to have been in continuous use since its conception. The route continues onto the fringes of the Llyn Peninsula and St Cybi's Well, whilst Cymer Abbey near Dolgellau is a secluded reminder of Wales' monastic past.

North Wales Coastal Route (5)

Anglesey – Chester 105 miles
The North Wales Coastal Route crosses the top of Wales and hugs the Irish Sea for a large part of its 105 miles (170km) between Holyhead and Chester. You will not fail to be overwhelmed by the mighty Conwy Castle, including its fascinating chapel tower with its recently commissioned stained glass windows. Discover the smallest cathedral in Britain at St Asaph which is set on the banks of the pretty River Elwy.

Lôn Teifi - (NCN 82)

Aberystwyth – Fishguard 98 Miles
Climbing a number of hills and winding through country lanes and quiet roads, this route is best suited to the more experience cyclist. In addition to the picture-perfect countryside and abundance of wildlife you will also find an array of sacred sites including the ancient ruins of Strata Florida Abbey that was once a centre of Welsh culture and worship, and the mighty Cilgerran Castle. At the southern end of this route is the incredible St Davids Cathedral and the Bishops Palace - a place of pilgrimage since the 12th century.

Llwybr Beicio Mannau Cysegredig Cymru Gyfan

Beth am ystryried yr her eithaf? Drwy ddilyn y Rhwydwaith Beicio Cenedlaethol yn bennaf gallwch deithio o amgylch Cymru gyfan yn ymweld â'i holl Eglwysy Cadeiriol a llu o'i manau mwyaf cysgredig a gwerthfawr. Her gorfforol a fyddai hefyd yn rhoi'r cyfle i chi feddwl ac archwilio ystyr dyfnach yr hyn a ddatgelir gan y lleoedd rhyfeddol hyn.

The Celtic Trail (4)

Fishguard – Chepstow 223 miles
Route 4 of the popular Celtic Trail stretches across the entire breadth of south Wales, taking in stunning coastlines, beautiful countryside, great Valley adventures and an abundance of magnificent castles and sacred sites. Visit the historically important Newport Cathedral and discover 15 centuries of Welsh history. Be sure to take in Margam Abbey along with the wonderul Cetic crosses at Margam Stones Museum, Take a detour to picturesque Neath Abbey, just off route 47. You can also see some wonderful castles en route including Chepstow, Kidwelly and Caerphilly, as well as Laugharne Castle where literary greats Dylan Thomas and Richard Hughes once found inspiration within its grounds.

Taff Trail

Cardiff – Brecon 55 miles
The highly popular and largely traffic free Taff Trail takes in two beautiful cathedrals, Llandaff and Brecon as well as passing by the fairy tale castle of Castell Coch, home to devout Christian, the Marquis of Bute, the highly decorated interior contains rich religious iconography. Llandaff Cathedral is one of the UK's oldest Christian cathedrals in the ancient "City of Llandaff". At the end of the route you will be rewarded by Brecon's magnificent eleventh century cathedral. Head further north out of Brecon on Lon Las (NCN 8) and be sure to visit Maesyrnnon Chapel, one of the oldest non-conformist chapel buildings in Wales (though it started life as a barn!).

All Wales' Sacred Places Cycle Trail

Why not consider the ultimate cycling challenge? By following mostly National Cycle Network you can circumnavigate the whole of Wales visiting all its Cathedrals and a host of its most sacred and precious places. A physical challenge that would also give you the chance to think and explore the deeper meaning of things as revealed by these amazing places.
